Generalization





New Zealand Policy

There will be one person from the team who the family/ whanau link with and others may become involved to help with specific goals. The team will work at the family/ whanau's home or early childhood education setting, as this is the most natural setting for the child, with the adults who spend the most time with the child.





1. The professional works with the adult, not the child








2. Caregiver has opportunity to set agenda




6. Professional refers to family's informal supports before formal supports, for helping with some solutions






7. Professional always concerned about the primary caregiver's well-being





8. Professional frequently checks on family's emotional support






9. Professional attends to basic needs before anything else






10. Professional prepared to provide or help find information: child development, disability, resources, intervention





11. Child functioning always discussed in context of a routine





12. Professional looks for opportunities to encourage evidence-based (and fun) parenting

1. Contexts where life happens

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
Routines-based early intervention helps families find the accommodations that suit them and that are effective with the child.




